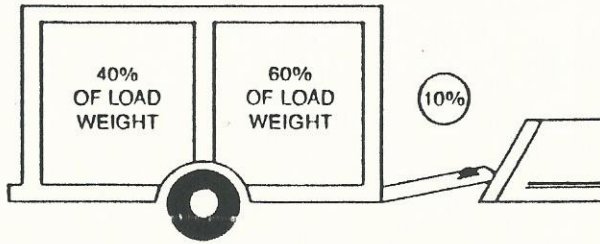


# UTILITY TRAILER INSTRUCTION SHEET



## SAFETY RULES:

1. When loading the trailer, place 60% of the load in the front half of the trailer for stability.
2. Most trailers are for local use only.
3. The maximum weight of a load is 1,200 pounds for single axle trailers and 2,000 pounds for tandem axle trailers.
4. Utility trailers are not intended to haul dirt, rocks, sand, sod, bricks, gravel, lumber, firewood, broken up concrete, or scrap iron.
5. Check this chart to account for the weight of these items, and see why utility trailers are not intended to haul them.

Cubic yard of sand, gravel, dirt .....	3,000 lbs.
Cubic yard of wet concrete .....	4,500 lbs.
Cubic yard of broken concrete .....	4,000 lbs.
Cord of firewood .....	5,000 lbs.
Pallet of red brick .....	3,200 lbs.
Pallet of sod .....	2,000 lbs.
Pallet of concrete block .....	3,000 lbs.

6. Total ground height cannot exceed 13 feet.
7. The load must not extend more than 3 feet from the rear of the utility trailer.
8. Check the hitch installation after loading and unloading the trailer.
9. Never tighten the coupler with a wrench.
10. Trailers are not to be disconnected from the towing vehicle. Improper reconnection may result in loss or damage to the trailer or its contents.
11. Trailers are allowed in the right two lanes only.
12. The load must be covered if there is a possibility of any debris blowing out of the trailer.
13. Trailer brake, tail lights, and turn signals are required to be hooked up to the towing vehicle.
14. Mirrors are also required if your vision is obstructed by the trailer or the load.
15. All damage to the tires and tubes caused by blowout bruises, cuts, punctures, road hazards or other causes is the responsibility of the customer.
